Dear E.S.S.

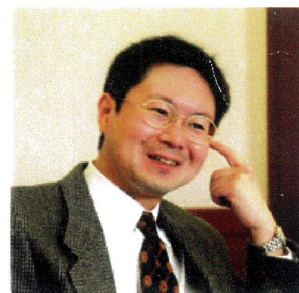

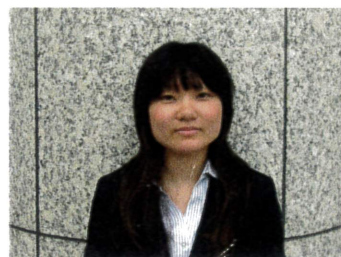

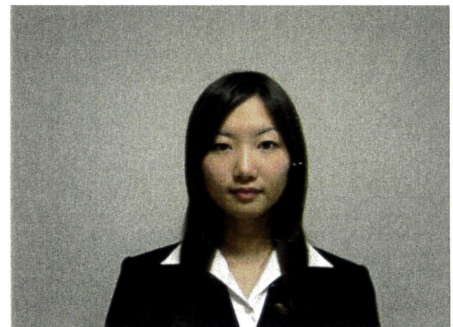
1. Making all sophomore unite

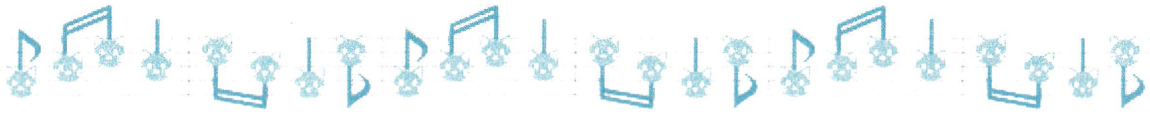

My friends always helped me no matter what. So, I hope to help them with my smile and my easygoing attitude. That's what I am thinking—modestly of course.

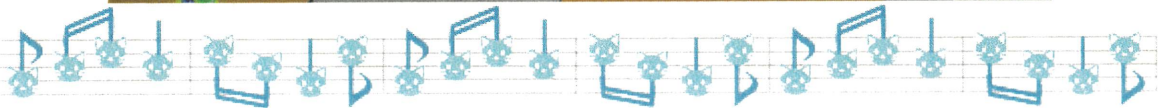
