GREETING

In the field of researching academic subjects, we are now ready to make use of various English expressions which we have practiced during this past year.

By having set up a new organization it is certain that we are now in a position to study various subjects in a natural type of institution in the University. If you, all the members, will conscientiously study and grow in knowledge as a result of our club, I shall be highly gratified. With your close cooperation and wholehearted enthusiasm, success is assured for us. Let us do our best for the E.S.S.!

I hope and believe that all the students of the university will give ready cooperation for the event and make it a success which it certainly deserves.

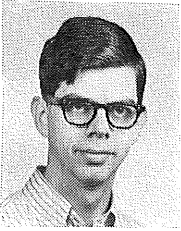

THE ORGANIZATION OF E.S.S.

The organization of Kansai University of Foreign Studies English Studying Society can be roughly divided into two parts: the General Meeting and the General Committee. The former is the highest resolutionary organ of the society, where the plans from the General Committee are determined, and is presided over by the chairman of it. It must be called more than three times a year by the request of the president of the requirement of over two thirds of the membership of the society.

The General Committee is the highest planning and executive organ of the society and is divided into three main departments for efficient management; such as General Affairs Dept., the planning Dept., and the Paymasters Dept., each of which is organized by a few standing committees with some subcommittees. It is usually made up of the president, the representative out side of E,S,S, five vice presidents, the assistants of the president, who take the role of the manager for one of those departments, every section leader, and every year leader. Occasionally, the chairman of the standing committees are required to attend the General Committee. It is managed under the superintendence of the president where they draft all kinds of plans and schedules, come up with them to the General Meeting for determination and carry them into execution. Of course, they occasionally seek advisers opinions.

As to daily activities, E.S.S. has now eight sections: the Politics Section, the Economics Section, the Sociology Section, the Religion Section, the History Section, the Literature Section, the English Conversation Section, and the Linguistics Section, and the sophomore, the junior, and the senior, have to be enrolled one of these sections according to his or her interest. And the Freshmen has to study basic English and daily conversation, and discuss some title for one year.

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THE SUMMER LODGING IN SHINSHU

We had our Summer Lodging in Shinshu from the 13th to the 18th of July. Besides the section activities, we had various oral English practice, discussions, debates and the English oratorical Speech Contest.

We also had some entertainments; camp-fire, stunts, dancing party and so on, and at free time, some of us went swimming. We went to Lake Nojiri and have our dinner on a board.

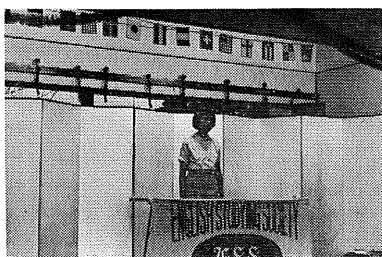

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FROM THE EDITOR'S ROOM


